Control measures within this risk assessment apply to the whole Marling School community (Staff AND Students) to minimise the ongoing risks of transmission of the virus following removal of Government restrictions in July 2021. This Risk Assessment should be used in conjunction with all other School and Department Risk Assessments and Policies, which still apply.

Government guidance states that schools must adopt measures in a way that addresses the risks identified in their assessment, works for our school, and allows us to deliver a broad and balanced curriculum for our students, including full educational and care support for students with SEND. The school's Risk Assessment has regard to government guidance, which in turn has regard to WHO guidance. The latter expressly considers the ages at which a child should wear a mask/face covering

Prevention:

- 1) Minimise contact with individuals who are required to self-isolate by ensuring they do not attend school.
- 2) Students to undergo return-to-school testing in asymptomatic testing centre, 2 tests 3-5 days apart with a staggered start in September. Students and staff to continue twice weekly self-test.
- 3) Advise to clean hands thoroughly more often than usual
- 4) Ensure good respiratory hygiene by promoting the 'catch it, bin it, kill it' approach
- 5) Continue enhanced cleaning, including cleaning frequently touched surfaces using standard products such as detergents, bleach and proven sanitisers.
- 6) Maintain social distancing wherever possible
- 7) Keep occupied spaces well ventilated
- 8) Students and staff may continue to wear face covering, if wished, in areas where 2m distance cannot be maintained.

Response to any infection:

- 9) Engage with the NHS Test and Trace process as appropriate
- 10) Adopt Outbreak Management Measures
- 11) Following local health protection team advice

Outbreak Management Plan

Outbreak Management will be led by the Business Manager, in communication with the local health protection team and the School Leadership Team.

In the event of a localised outbreak, the following measures may be temporarily re-introduced at any time. Any changes to school operations will be communicated to parents and staff via email.

Face Covering	Face covering (masks) may be re-introduced in the event of a localised outbreak. This may be in all areas, or in areas where social distancing is not possible, such as corridors and communal areas. Students may be asked to wear face masks on school and public transport. Face masks will be made available from school stocks if guidance is introduced at short notice.
