Most inspirational teacher growing up? My geography teacher. He inspired my love for geography and gave me the enthusiasm for my subject. I wanted to teach, because of him!


Tell us something we didn't know about you? My team and I recently won a netball competition. I have a t shirt and medal to prove it!


