Marling School Uniform

Aims

Marling School considers the appearance of students to be important, both in school and during the journey to and from school. Parents and carers are asked to support us in maintaining high standards.

All Marling School students in Years 7 - 11 are required to wear the uniform as described in the uniform and games kit lists below. These uniform requirements are designed to be:

- Smart, promoting a cohesive culture and 'ready for work' mindset among students
- Comfortable, hard-wearing and easy to clean
- Financially accessible for all families

Only the items highlighted in bold on the uniform and games kit lists are branded or specific items that cannot be substituted for a non-branded alternative which can be sourced from a wide range of stockists. The number of such items is kept to a minimum to make the overall uniform as affordable as possible. Each item is routinely checked to ensure it represents good value for money.

Uniform List

- Blazer Black, single-breasted with black buttons and the Marling School badge
- School tie in the colour of the student's House
- Plain black formal school trousers belts should be black with a plain buckle (No 'jean' style trousers with
 external sewn pockets). Plain white shirt worn with the school tie. (The top button should be done up and
 the shirt fully tucked in at all times) No visible undershirts should be worn
- Marling black V-necked jumper or smart plain black V-necked knitted jumper Note: The jumper should be worn under (not instead of) a blazer
- Socks plain dark grey or black
- Plain black shoes (office shoes), not boots, trainers or trainer type shoes (see shoe guidance document on the website)
- A suitable overcoat without large logos

No hoodies of any kind to be worn as a coat or jumper – a hoody is defined as a hooded sweatshirt with or without a zipper.

No jewellery of any sort is permissible, except for watches or items required for religious purposes.

Hairstyles should reflect the fact that students are at School primarily to work, not to make a fashion statement. Hair should be tidy in style and of a colour natural to the student (shaven or near shaven heads are not acceptable.

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Games Kit

For PE and Games the following items will be needed:

- PE vest in House colour (Students may, when the weather dictates, wear a plain white T- shirt under their house vest as an extra layer during lessons)
- White PE shorts
- White socks
- Suitable sports trainers, non- marking soles
- Rugby shirt
- Navy rugby shorts
- Rugby socks
- Rugby/football boots

Bateman's offer a mid-layer top in School colours which may be worn when the weather dictates but this is OPTIONAL.

We suggest that you do not buy expensive boots while your child's feet are still growing.

NEW ITEMS

Bateman's Sports in Stroud stock all items of required Marling School uniform as well as some additional (not required) items. Parents and carers may purchase online or in the store (appointment advisable during the summer). Parents and carers may also choose to buy most items of school uniform from other suppliers but should be aware of the following:

- A Marling School blazer may only be sourced from Batemans. We believe these blazers are hard-wearing, robust and represent good value for money. They ensure consistent appearance of students day to day.
- Marling School ties may only be sourced from Bateman's as we believe these custom-made ties represent good value for money and promote our House team structure.
- The Marling School rugby shirt may only be purchased from Bateman's so that students look identical for team sports. We believe these shirts are hard-wearing, robust and represent good value for money. They are also reversible for in-school team sport identification.
- The PE vest may only be purchased from Bateman's so that student House colours are consistent. These vests are hard-wearing and represent good value for money.
- Marling rugby socks may only be purchased at Bateman's as these represent good value for money and help identify teams during away matches.

Branding has been minimised to facilitate parental choice in uniform stockist. Sports clothing items are no longer required to be embroidered with the student's name, although we do strongly advise ALL clothing and shoes are labelled inside so that lost property can be returned easily.
